The philosophy student explores and seeks to understand values and the nature of reality. What is truth? What is morally right? What kind of life is best? What kind of society? Is there an ultimate reality? Philosophy studies questions such as these that most other subject areas are unable to address fully.

What you can learn in Philosophy:

- Ethics: How should people act?
- **Epistemology:** What do people know and how do they know it?
- **Metaphysics:** Is this the real life or is this just fantasy?
- **History:** Philosophical ideas and concepts through time, including ancient, medieval, modern, Western, Asian, religious or secular traditions.
- Writing: How to write logical, analytical essays using critical thinking, evaluation, and correct reasoning.

- Analyze policies for fairness and accuracy
- Present your case convincingly
- Develop creative solutions to unique situations

Choose at least 5 (15 units): Upper division philosophy courses are 300-, 400-, or 500-level courses. No more than six units (2 courses) of 300-level philosophy courses will count toward the minor.
